

OPENING NIGHT! BALLET AND BOLÉRO

September 28, 2024 | 8 PM

Robinson Fine Arts Center

What better way to open the 2024–2025 Season than with a **world premiere** by **Robert Xavier Rodríguez** who *Texas Monthly* has called “one of the major American composers of his generation.” Joining Maestro Guzmán and the PSO for this very special concert is the Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, one of the most exciting ballet companies in the country, performing a beautiful pas de deux from *Swan Lake* as well as Ravel’s sensuous *Boléro*, with choreography by Susan Jaffe.

Robert Xavier Rodríguez has served as Composer-in-Residence with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, and his music is published exclusively by G. Schirmer, with 46 of his works released on CDs. Rodríguez’s new PSO commission *Tlaloc* is a celebration of the ancient Aztec god of rain, thunder, and fertility, and it features multiple percussion instruments and dramatic echoes of pre-Hispanic Mexico. His music has been described as “romantically dramatic” (*The Washington Post*), “richly lyrical” (*Musical*

America), and “glowing with a physical animation and delicate balance of moods that combine seductively with his all-encompassing sense of humor” (*Los Angeles Times*).

Prepare to be spellbound as the **Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre** takes the stage for *Boléro*. “It’s a single melody that repeats as a solo in numerous instruments, slowly growing in volume and passion, developmentally linear. It’s not a story so much as a straight line. [At a performance in 2023], the dancers matched this energy, whirling sinuously in a beautifully controlled expression of joy. As the music increased in power, the dancers’ movements grew wilder and more complex, blooming imaginatively until a final, pounding cadence brought the evening to a spirited close” (*Pittsburgh Post-Gazette*).

Also appearing will be PSO Concertmaster **Elisabeth Adkins** performing *Concerto for Violin and Orchestra* by S. Barber.

What do a masked hero, a harmonica, and an enduring American favorite have in common? They're all a part of our second concert of the season! From the *William Tell Overture* to Gershwin's rhapsodic ballet *An American in Paris*, it'll be an evening of joyful music and entertainment—especially once you hear a medley of Elvis Presley's greatest hits as you have never heard them before! Guest artist **Robert Bonfiglio** joins the PSO with his unique style in a tribute to the "King of Rock and Roll."

Called "the Paganini of the harmonica" by the *Los Angeles Times*, Robert Bonfiglio has

dazzled audiences at Carnegie Hall, the Hollywood Bowl, the Gewandhaus, Teatro Colón, Teatro Massimo, Teatro Amazonas, Kennedy Center, Boston Symphony Hall, and Lincoln Center with his ability to both play Harmonica Concertos and sizzle on the blues. Robert has appeared on *CBS New Sunday Morning*, *CBS Mornings*, *Live with Regis and Kathie Lee*, *Larry King Live*, *The Jim Bohannon Show*, and Garrison Keillor's *American Radio Show*. He has had feature stories and reviews in *The New York Times*, *The Boston Globe*, the *Los Angeles Times*, *The Washington Post*, and the *Chicago Tribune*.

Picture the energy and excitement of a rock concert mixed with the power and emotion of a symphony orchestra. Combined with the technology, interactivity, stunning visuals, and fun that only video games can provide, this award-winning immersive concert event features music from the most popular video games of all time: *Final Fantasy*, *Halo*, *Warcraft*, and *Skyrim*—just to name a few! Synchronized cutting-edge video screen visuals, state-of-the-art lighting, and special effects are sure to dazzle crowds of all ages—gamers and non-gamers alike.

Incorporated in 2002, **Video Games Live** is the first and most successful video game touring concert in the world, having performed over 500 shows in 43 countries on 5 continents including multiple sold out shows in venues such as the Bird's Nest National Olympic Stadium in Beijing, the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., the Royal Festival Hall in London, and Red Rocks in Colorado. Over 11,000 people were present for the debut performance at the Hollywood Bowl with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and since then, over two million people have experienced the show live.

With 25 years of international concerts and recordings of original repertoire, **Tambuco Percussion Ensemble** has enjoyed an acclaimed career, establishing itself among the finest percussion quartets today. Audiences throughout the world have appreciated Tambuco's musicianship in programs devoted to showcasing a vast universe of percussion music.

The PSO is also honored to perform a commissioned **world premiere** from the brilliant young composer **Quinn Mason**. The composition, *Shine Time*, is a short showpiece for orchestra designed to showcase the

virtuosity of the PSO and celebrate Maestro Héctor Guzmán's 41 fruitful seasons with the orchestra.

Praised as "one of the most sought-after young composers in the country" (*Texas Monthly*), composer and conductor Quinn Mason has distinguished himself as an artist of national and international renown. He recently finished a successful tenure as Artist in Residence of the Hartford Symphony Orchestra for the 2022-2023 Season. He also recently served as the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's Classical Roots composer in residence in 2022 (the youngest composer appointed to that role) and as KMFA 89.5's inaugural composer in residence.

“Celebrating fanfare with unbridled energy and vivacity.” That’s how composer **Xi Wang** describes the commissioned piece making its world premiere at the PSO’s final concert of the season. Special guests include the return of internationally acclaimed pianist **Alessio Bax**, who wowed PSO patrons back in 2014, and the Plano Civic Chorus performing works by Strauss, Rachmaninoff, and Borodin in a season finale you won’t want to miss!

Xi Wang’s original concert music has been commissioned and performed worldwide by notable orchestras such as the Philadelphia Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, Dallas Symphony, Atlanta Symphony, Shanghai Philharmonic, and more. Xi Wang is the recipient of the Charles Ives Fellowship from the American Academy of Arts and Letters. Currently, she’s an Associate Professor at SMU’s Meadows School of Arts where she received the Rotunda Award for Outstanding Teaching.

Combining exceptional lyricism and insight with consummate technique, Alessio Bax is without a doubt “among the most remarkable young pianists now before the public” (Gramophone). He catapulted to prominence with First Prize wins at both the Leeds and Hamamatsu International Piano Competitions, and is now a familiar face on five continents, not only as a recitalist and chamber musician, but also as a concerto soloist who has appeared with more than 150 orchestras, including the London, Royal, and St. Petersburg Philharmonic Orchestras, the New York, Boston, Dallas, and more, collaborating with such eminent conductors as Marin Alsop, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Sir Andrew Davis, Fabio Luisi, Sir Simon Rattle, Yuri Temirkanov, and Jaap van Zweden.

EDUCATION AND OUTREACH PROGRAMS

The PSO's music education and community outreach programs have been recognized for their thoughtful curating of educational experiences that extend well beyond the concert setting.



The **SCHOOL CONCERT EDUCATION PROGRAM**, our largest outreach program, is designed to be an integral part of the fine arts curriculum for elementary school students. Of the 150 participating schools in 7 area school districts, 39% serve Title I students. The program consists of an online TEKS-based multi-media presentation and PSO musician in-person school campus visits, culminating in a concert experience field trip given during the second semester.

The **INSTRUMENT PETTING ZOO** is a free outreach program featuring a selection of instruments made available for use by libraries, schools, and at community festivals and private events, often providing a child's first opportunity to handle and experience the power of making music.



The **PSO PIT PROGRAM**, in partnership with North Texas Performing Arts, trains student musicians to play in dynamic theatrical settings, providing opportunities to collaborate with theatre artists and preparing them for a multi-faceted musical career.

The **PSO SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** funds private year-long instrumental lessons for qualifying PISD middle school students. Scholarships are awarded based on director referral and financial need.



The **COLLIN COUNTY YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION** provides gifted young musicians with the opportunity to showcase their talents and compete for a chance to perform as a featured soloist with the PSO.



HEALING NOTES is an interactive music therapy program for seniors and incarcerated youth. Partners include area senior living and rehabilitation facilities, private memory care centers, hospitals, and the Collin County Juvenile Detention Center. These programs are presented free to those in attendance, made possible through community sponsors and partnerships. Thank you to the AWARE Foundation for sponsoring the 2024-2025 program.



The two-week **SUMMER ORCHESTRA PROGRAMS** are for woodwind, brass, string, and percussion students in 3rd-12th grade. Available July 8-19, 2024, the morning Summer Camp session is open to instrumental students of all levels, and the afternoon session is a Summer Institute for advanced players by audition. All sessions include full orchestra rehearsal and a variety of classes including conducting, music therapy, instrument repair, and improvisation. All students will perform in final concerts on July 19, 2024.

As part of the summer programs, the PSO will present a concert for community members of all ages: "Songs of the Earth." This multimedia concert will explore the wonders of our planet through orchestral music of the past and present.

The all-American concert will include popular and classical music. It will be a night of music for the entire family to enjoy!




