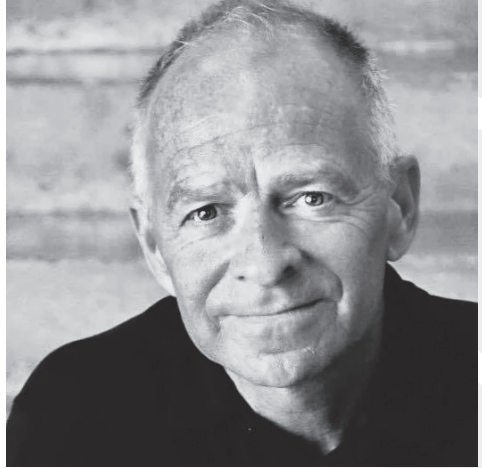

Even some of the best seats in the house were only \$61.25. These are subscription prices, which are always the best value.

While it is customary to hold your applause until the end of a multi-movement piece, feel free to appreciate a performance whenever you are moved to do so. Recognition from an enthusiastic audience is very gratifying to the performers on stage. No applause is a much bigger worry on the bright side of the footlights! Don't hold back.

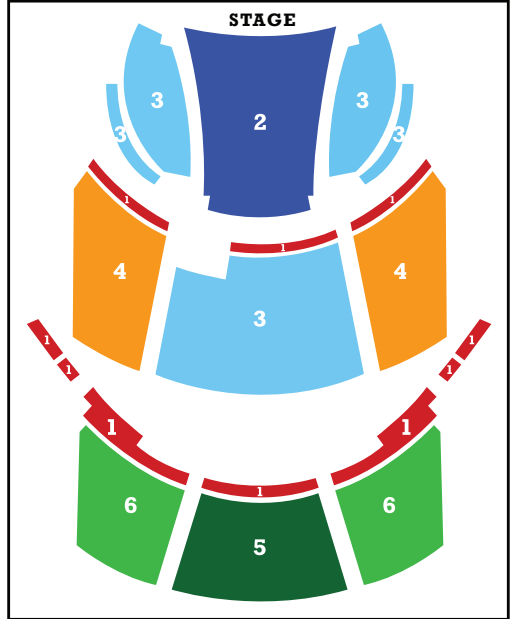

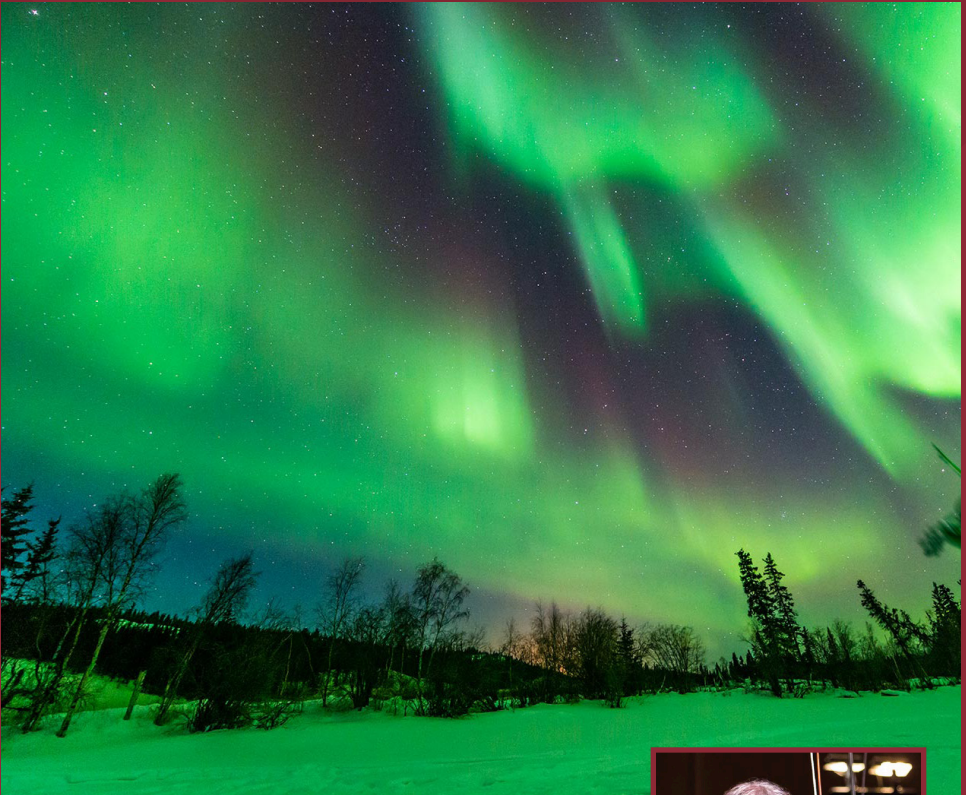


Don't miss our annual holiday tradition, **Home for the Holidays**, a heartwarming concert filled with festive cheer!

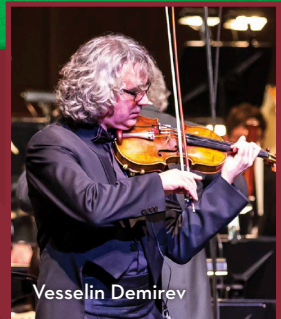

EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS

The PSO's music education and community engagement programs have been recognized for their thoughtful curating of educational experiences that extend well beyond the concert setting.



The **SCHOOL CONCERTS** are the cornerstone of our educational programming and an integral part of the fine arts curriculum for elementary school students. Of the 150 participating schools in 7 area school districts, 39% serve Title I students. The program consists of an online TEKS-based multimedia presentation and PSO musician in-person school campus visits, culminating in a concert experience field trip given during the second semester.

The **INSTRUMENT PETTING ZOO** is a free program featuring a selection of instruments made available for use by libraries, schools, and at community festivals and private events, often providing a child's first opportunity to handle and experience the power of making music.



The **PSO PIT PROGRAM**, in partnership with North Texas Performing Arts, trains student musicians to play in dynamic theatrical settings, providing opportunities to collaborate with theatre artists and preparing them for a multi-faceted musical career.



The **PSO SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** funds year-long private instrumental lessons for qualifying PISD middle school students. Scholarships are awarded based on director referral and financial need.



The **COLLIN COUNTY YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION** provides gifted young musicians with the opportunity to showcase their talents and compete for a chance to perform as a featured soloist with the PSO.

HEALING NOTES is an interactive music-therapy program for seniors and incarcerated youth. Partners include area senior living and rehabilitation facilities, private memory care centers, hospitals, and the Collin County Juvenile Detention Center. These programs are presented free to those in attendance, made possible through community sponsors and partnerships.



The two-week **SUMMER ORCHESTRA PROGRAMS** will be July 7-18, 2025, for woodwind, brass, string, and percussion students in 3rd-12th grade. The morning summer camp session is open to instrumental students of all levels, and the afternoon session consists of an advanced institute orchestra and intermediate academy orchestra. All sessions include full orchestra rehearsals and a variety of classes including conducting, music therapy, instrument repair, and improvisation. All students will perform in final concerts on July 18, 2025 at 6:00 PM.

PSO FAMILY SERIES

PSO chamber ensembles entertain and engage through music from popular movies and classical repertoire. Acting, storytelling, dancing, and puppetry bring music to life in these programs, and kids are encouraged to participate in the action! Family Series concerts were held in Plano, Frisco, McKinney, and Addison in 2024-2025 and included a sensory friendly performance.



WOMEN COMPOSER SERIES

Through a collaboration between the PSO Education and Music departments, the Women Composer Series will enter its third year in 2026. This series will continue to feature pieces from contemporary and historic female composers to celebrate the symphonic and chamber music contributions of women in classical music.

PSO NEW MUSIC THAT MATTERS

The Plano Symphony Orchestra is dedicated to bringing new music into the world through presenting world premieres: by the commissioning of local composers to create new pieces of music and by the addition of a new Composer in Residence Program.

These world premieres and new compositions have brought a unique perspective to the Plano Symphony from a wide array of talented writers.

David Lovrien - *Toccata on Carol of the Bells* and *Hark! The Herald Angels Sing* were gifted to the PSO and premiered. The PSO also premiered the first orchestral version of *Minor Alterations*, *Minor Alterations #2*, and *Minor Alterations #3*. *Slumber Party* was commissioned and performed by a chamber ensemble.

Jack Waldenmeier - *Second Violin Concerto* world premiere

Robert Xavier Rodriguez - *Tlaloc*, commissioned by PSO

Quinn Mason - *Shine Time*, commissioned by PSO

Xi Wang - *A Not So Short Ride in a Burning Machine*, commissioned by PSO

Sergey Tsoy - The PSO premiered several of his short pieces for orchestra.

Eugenio Castillo - The PSO commissioned and premiered the orchestral version of Glen Miller's *Moonlight Serenade* as well as *Libertango* by Astor Piazzolla.

Rodrigo Loman - The PSO premiered his *Hueteque* for orchestra in the USA.

Tom Whitman - *Counter Clockwise* was commissioned by PSO for students to perform at the PSO Summer Program.

Olga Amelkina Vera - The string orchestra version of *New Oceans* was commissioned by the PSO to play with PSO and Plano Senior High orchestra students.

Through a generous grant from Tammy and Charles Miller, the 2025-2026 Season will include a new Composer in Residence Program. We have selected Mexican composer **Marcos Lifshitz** to be the first to serve in this role.
